

## **Kimberly C. Kur, JD, CAP®**



As ACF's Senior Vice President for Planned Giving and Advancement at the Arizona Community Foundation, Kimberly oversees the foundation's statewide asset development activities, including ACF's Center for Planned Giving. Kimberly is responsible for training and guiding ACF's statewide teams in areas of planned giving, donor stewardship, prospect management and partnering with professional advisors. Kimberly also works closely herself with existing and future donors, nonprofits and professional advisors to facilitate lifetime and planned charitable gifts. During her tenure at ACF, which began in July 2000, she has seen the foundation grow from \$325 million to over \$1 billion today.

In March 2013 through February 2014, Kimberly served as the Chief Development Officer (CDO) for the Jewish Community Association of Greater Phoenix. Created in 2012, the Association combined the former Jewish Federation of Greater Phoenix, the Ina Levine Jewish Community Campus and the Valley of the Sun Jewish Community Center (VOSJCC). As CDO, Kimberly was responsible for all aspects of the organization's asset development as well as its community planning functions.

Prior to moving to Arizona in December 1999, Kimberly practiced as an estate planning attorney at a Philadelphia law firm. Before that, she served as a judicial law clerk for the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.

Kimberly is a cum laude graduate of Temple University Beasley School of Law and earned her Bachelor of Arts in political science from the University of Pennsylvania. In 2018, Kimberly earned her Chartered Advisor in Philanthropy designation from the American College of Financial Services.

Kimberly's current professional memberships include the Advancement Network, Inc., Planned Giving Round Table of Arizona, Central Arizona Estate Planning Council, Valley Estate Planners and the Financial Planners Association of Greater Phoenix. Kimberly serves as a mentor to nonprofits going through the Arizona Endowment Building Institute and serves on multiple nonprofit development, endowment building and planning giving committees.

Kimberly is an active lay leader in the Jewish community, serving in numerous leadership roles during her 21 years in Arizona. Currently, Kimberly serves on the board of ASU Hillel.
